WILLY WONKA & THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY' ON THE BIG SCREEN AND DROP-IN FAMILY WORKSHOPS TO BE OFFERED DURING THANKSGIVING WEEKEND

November 25–27, 2016

Astoria, Queens, New York, October 4, 2016—During the Thanksgiving holiday recess, Museum of the Moving Image will present family programs featuring matinee screenings of the classic 1971 musical film *Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory*, starring the beloved comic actor Gene Wilder, accompanied by the **"Sweets on Screen" workshop**. These programs will be offered daily from **Friday, November 25 through Sunday, November 27,** with the film beginning at 12:30 p.m. and the workshop from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (drop-in basis, no reservation required). Recommended ages: 5+, accompanied by an adult.

Tickets for *Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory* range from \$7 for youth (ages 3–17) to \$12 adults. Screenings are free for Museum members at the Film Lover and MoMI Kids Premium levels and above. Ticket purchase may be applied toward same-day Museum admission (ranging from \$7 for youth to \$15 adults). Admission to the workshop is free with Museum admission.

Families are also welcome to visit *Behind the Screen*, the Museum's dynamic, interactive core exhibition which explores how movies, television programs, and digital entertainment are made, marketed, and shown.

In addition, beginning November 12, the Museum will reopen its weekly drop-in **Moving Image Studio**, a "maker space" where visitors can create media and other projects. Activities range from making hand-drawn flipbooks and optical toys called thaumatropes to building computer-based stop-motion animations and video games. Recommended ages: 7+, accompanied by an adult. (Every Saturday, 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., with the exception of November 26 and December 31, when holiday workshops will be offered instead.)

This adaptation of Roald Dahl's children's book about five children, including hero Charlie, who win a coveted trip to a chocolate factory, is (according to Roger Ebert) "probably the best film of its sort since *The Wizard of Oz.*" These screenings are also part of the Museum's tribute to Gene Wilder (1933–2016), the beloved film and theater actor, screenwriter, director, and author whose death in August saddened millions of fans around the world.
